Sermon Summary

Common sense says we gain by getting and keeping. Charity is fine and good in moderation because there is only so much to go around. But Jesus' "Uncommon Sense" is based not on a mindset of scarcity but one of abundance.

Discussion Questions

What is the best or worst purchase that you've ever made?

What do you remember from last week's discussion? What was your takeaway and application?

READ Luke 18:18-27

Why do you think Jesus stopped him and said what He said in verse 19?

This text is not about buying eternal life, but about following Jesus and holding everything that we have loosely. Why do you think this was so disappointing to this man?

It is impossible for us to replace our love of money (or anything else) with a love for God by our own power. But Jesus makes that possible. Has God ever called you to give up something specific in order for you to follow Him more closely? If not, what do you need to give over to Jesus so that you can follow Him more closely?

READ Colossians 1:15-16

Why is it so easy to confess this knowledge with our mouth, but fail to live with that knowledge in our heart?

Let's look at it this way: What if you loved Jesus as much as you love _____?

What needs to change for that to happen?
