Sermon Summary

April 4-5: Not Forgotten (Palm Sunday)

Sometimes it feels like God has forgotten us. Things happen that we do not like and all we can see is more of the same on the horizon. We read the promises in the Bible and they feel a long way off. And then it happens, God shows up. Not always as we expect, but there none the less, and when he does hope returns. We realize we were never forgotten in the first place. This is the joy we celebrate this Palm Sunday.

Discussion Questions

This week, with your group, use the Palm Sunday session of the Holy Week Devotional Guide.

Read about the Triumphal Entry and Jesus Weeping for Jerusalem:

Matthew 21:1-17, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-48, John 12:12-19

After reading all 4 accounts of the Triumphal Entry, what are some of the elements that jump out at you?

Did you notice anything that you hadn't noticed before?

What is the difference between the people's posture in that moment versus Jesus' posture? Is there a difference in focus?



In Luke's description of this event, he states that Jesus wept over the city. Why did Jesus weep? How might reviewing this bring your heart in line with His?
