A = ADMIT you are a sinner. Ask Jesus to forgive you for your sins and make you clean. | **John 1:4** "If we confess our sins he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness."

B = BELIEVE Jesus is God the Son. He died for our sins and rose from the dead. | **John 3:16** "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

C = COMMIT to love Jesus and obey him as your Lord. | **John 14:23** Jesus replied "If anyone loves me he will obey my teaching. My father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home in him."

PERSONAL FAITH

This brochure is intended to help parents decide if their child is ready to be baptized and to participate in communion.

Together, we are raising children who Love God, Love Each Other, and Make a Difference in their world.

BAPTISM

What is Baptism? The word 'baptism' comes from the Greek word 'baptizo' which means to dunk under water.

Being lowered into the water symbolizes our old self, along with our sins, being buried with Jesus.

The water reminds us that through Jesus' death our sins are washed away. Being raised out of the water shows we are raised to a new life in Christ.

Romans 6:4 *"We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life."*

When should my child be baptized?

At NorthRidge we wait to baptize children until they are old enough to make their own decision to follow Jesus.

As a general guideline we prefer to wait until a child is at least 7 years old. Many children will not be ready to understand the significance of faith and baptism until they are in their teen years.

It is important to be sure your child is comfortable enough with being dunked under the water before they are baptized. We don't want a fear of the water to distract your child from the true meaning of baptism.

How can I help my child prepare for baptism?

Devotional: In kid's ministry we suggest you walk your child through a 3 day devotional about baptism. This is a free download and you can access it by clicking above.

Talk to one of the pastors: When you feel your child is ready to be baptized please have them talk to one of the pastors. We would like to take a few moments to talk with them about their personal faith in Jesus and the significance of baptism. If your child would like, Jaci is happy to walk through one of the three days of the baptism devotional with them at this time.

BAPTISM IS A SIGNIFICANT MARKER IN A PERSON'S SPIRITUAL JOURNEY AS WELL AS AN IMPACTFUL TIME FOR THE GOSPEL TO BE SHARED. FAMILIES SHOULD CONSIDER WHO THEY WOULD LIKE TO INVITE TO SHARE THIS IMPORTANT EVENT.

COMMUNION

What is Communion? Communion and the Lord's Supper both refer to the bread and wine that Jesus shared with his disciples the night before he was crucified. At NorthRidge communion is usually observed on the first Sunday of each month during Sunday morning worship. When we take communion, we are celebrating the fact that Jesus' death and resurrection make it possible for us to be forgiven and to have a relationship with God.

1 Corinthians 11:23-29

CHILDREN WHO HAVE A PERSONAL FAITH IN JESUS ARE WELCOME TO PARTICIPATE IN THE LORD'S SUPPER WITH THEIR PARENTS.

Each time your child participates in the Lord's Supper they should be thinking of Jesus' love and sacrifice for them. If you don't feel your child is able to consider these things, it is better to have them wait to take communion.
